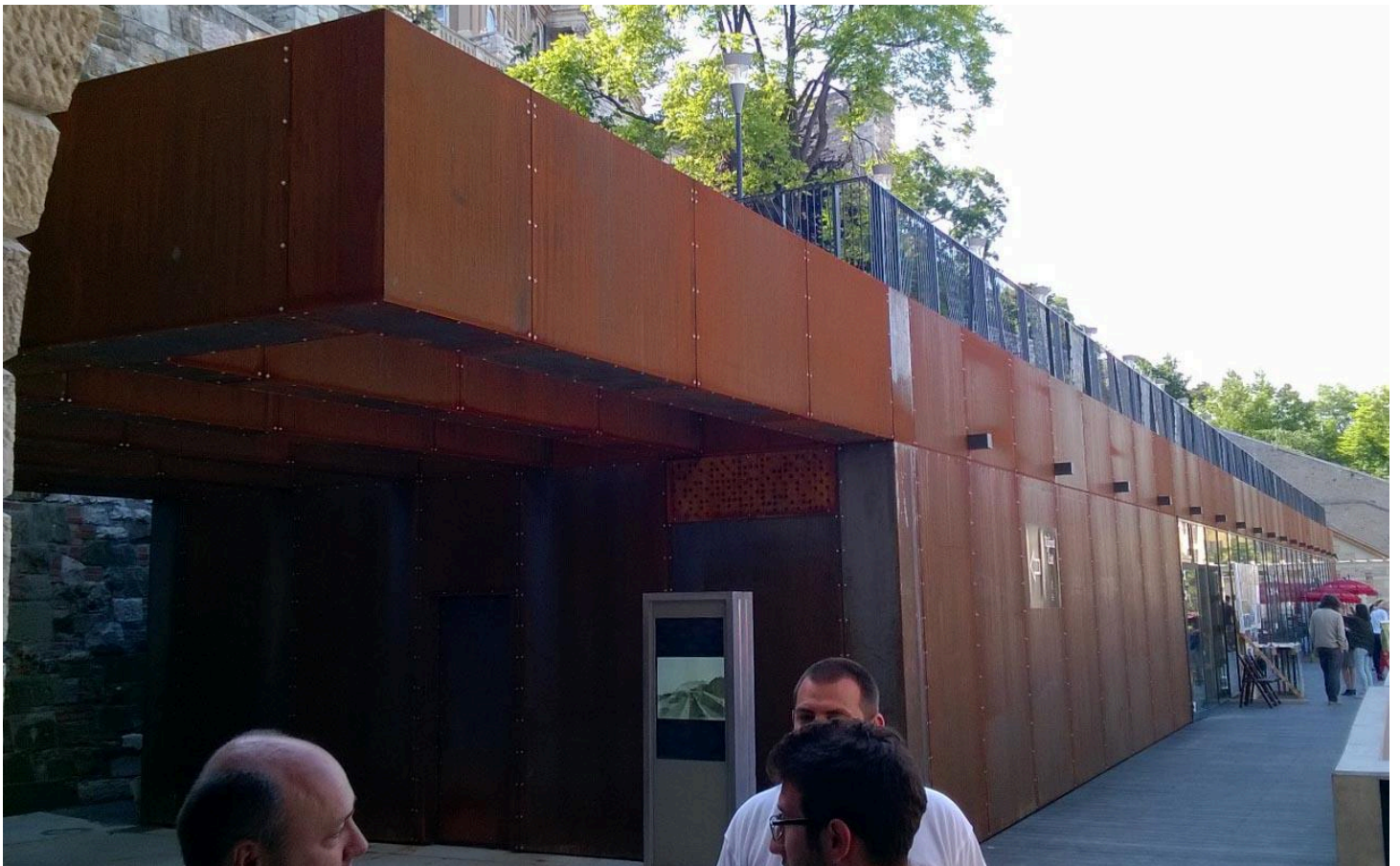


The Castle Garden Bazaar in Budapest

The Castle Garden Bazaar has been built between 1875 and 1883 in neo-renaissance style by Miklós Ybl, the most recognised Hungarian architect of that time. The 300 meter long building complex, which is now part of the UNESCO World Heritage site, was designed to both serve as an entrance and provide bordering for the Royal Gardens from the riverbank of the Danube.
